## Session 1 - Moving mainstream

Looking beyond the current disagreements over the regulations, this session will examine how ship recycling is moving into the mainstream and what it means for ship owners and operators. Session 4 - The business case

How can shipowners, brokers and cash buyers work together to make shiprecycling an economically sustainable business? The majority of shipowners are not interested in the minutiae of scrapping, but do pay extremely close attention to the value of their asset. Who and what actually determines the price owners receive? Currencies? Forward freight rate sentiment? Local steel prices? The cost of cash? Your broker having a bad day? Are cheap Chinese billets set to continue undercutting the inventory on Indian plots? Will the Modi government respond by raising duties on steel imports?

Are industry profits set to grow on the back of steel prices and younger ships being put up for sale? Are we heading for leaner times as shipbreakers' investment in their facilities results in lower prices being paid to ship owners?

Amid growing levels of commercial transparency, the final session examines how the business case for ship recycling is changing. It pulls all the strings together for a better understanding of the market dynamics.


